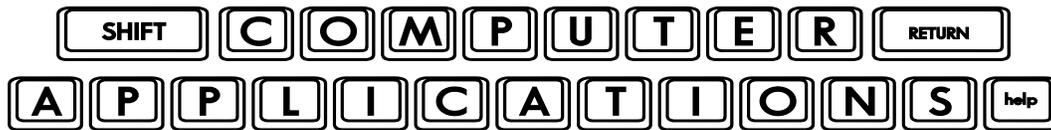

- I will set no worthless thing before my eyes; I hate the work of those who fall away; It shall not fasten its grip on me.  
Psalm 101:3 (NAS)
- Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things.  
Philippians 4:8 (NAS)
- Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O LORD, my rock and my Redeemer.  
Psalm 19:14 (NAS)
- Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear.  
Ephesians 4:29 (NAS)
- For the report of your obedience has reached to all; therefore I am rejoicing over you, but I want you to be wise in what is good and innocent in what is evil.  
Romans 16:19 (NAS)
