<u>Proverbs 1:2-6</u> – To know wisdom and instruction, To discern the sayings of understanding, To receive instruction in wise behavior, Righteousness, justice and equity; To give prudence to the naïve, To the youth knowledge and discretion, A wise man will hear and increase in learning, And a man of understanding will acquire wise counsel, To understand a proverb and a figure, The words of the wise and their riddles. (4)		
<u>Proverbs 2:1-7</u> – My son, if you will receive my sayings, And treasure my commandments within you, Make your ear attentive to wisdom, Incline your heart to understanding; For if you cry for discernment, Lift your voice for understanding; If you seek her as silver, And search for her as for hidden treasures; Then you will discern the fear of the Lord, And discover the knowledge of God. For the Lord gives wisdom; From His mouth come knowledge and understanding. He stores up sound wisdom for the upright; He is a shield to those who walk in integrity. (5)		
<u>Proverbs 15:14</u> – The mind of the intelligent seeks knowledge, But the mouth of fools feeds on folly. (1)		
<u>Proverbs 19:24</u> – The sluggard buries his hand in the dish, And will not even bring it back to his mouth. (1)		
<u>Matthew 22:37-38</u> – And He said to him, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and foremost commandment. (2)		
<u>I Peter 1:13</u> – Therefore, gird your minds for action, keep sober in spirit, fix your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. (1)		
<u>II Timothy 2:15</u> – Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, handling accurately the word of truth. (1)		
<u>Ephesians 5:15-16</u> – Therefore, be careful how you walk, not as unwise men, but as wise, making the most of your time, because the days are evil. So then, do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. (2)		
<u>I Timothy 6:20-21</u> – O Timothy, guard what has been entrusted to you, avoiding worldly and empty chatter and the opposing arguments of what is falsely called “knowledge” – which some have professed and thus gone astray from the faith. (2)		
<u>I Corinthians 14:20</u> – Brethren, do not be children in your thinking, yet in evil be babes, but in your thinking be mature. (1)		
<u>Ephesians 4:14-15</u> – As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming; but speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him, who is head, even Christ. (3)		
<u>I Corinthians 13:11</u> – When I was a child, I used to speak as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things. (1)		
<u>I Corinthians 8:1b</u> – Knowledge makes arrogant, but love edifies... (1)
